At the end of the semester, the students will be fully familiar, in a historical and literary context, with the main aspects of classical Greek and Roman literature; they will be able to interpret, appreciate and discuss sample texts and, thus, develop their critical skills; they will also be aware of the place of classical literature in the European literary tradition and, especially, of its importance for the study of English.
